REFLECTION

(Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24). The author of Wisdom lived in the middle of the first century BC. By that time belief in the blessed immortality of the just with God beyond death had become accepted. Our reading says that the world as God created it was essentially good. Human beings were created to be immortal because they were created in God's image. Death came into the world as a consequence of sin. The full bitterness of death will be experienced by those who are in league with the devil. It's clear that the author is not speaking of physical death (as even the virtuous still have to die) but of moral and spiritual death. This reading serves as a backdrop to the story of the raising of the daughter of Jairus in the gospel.

(Mk 5:21-43). In this gospel we have two more of the miracles referred to in the Scripture Note for last Sunday. In these we see Jesus' power over death, and over illness, often the forerunner of death. Mark stresses that both the woman with the haemorrhage and the daughter of Jairus were beyond the help of any earthly power. He also stresses the great faith of the woman and of Jairus. Both believed that Jesus possessed a supernatural power to heal. Through faith in Jesus, the woman and the little girl are saved. Both miracles are signs of God's power, restoring life and health through Jesus. The raising of the little girl is a foreshadowing of Jesus' gift of eternal life to all who believe in him.

(2 Cor 8:7,9,13-15). St Paul here is appealing to the Corinthians to contribute to a collection for the poor in the Church at Jerusalem. He offers two reasons why they should respond generously. Firstly, they have been blessed with an abundance of charismatic gifts. Secondly, the example of the Lord who emptied himself in order to enrich us.

and has brought us life through the Gospel.

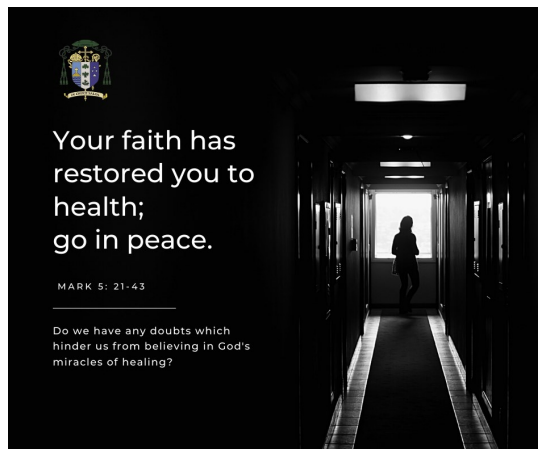
