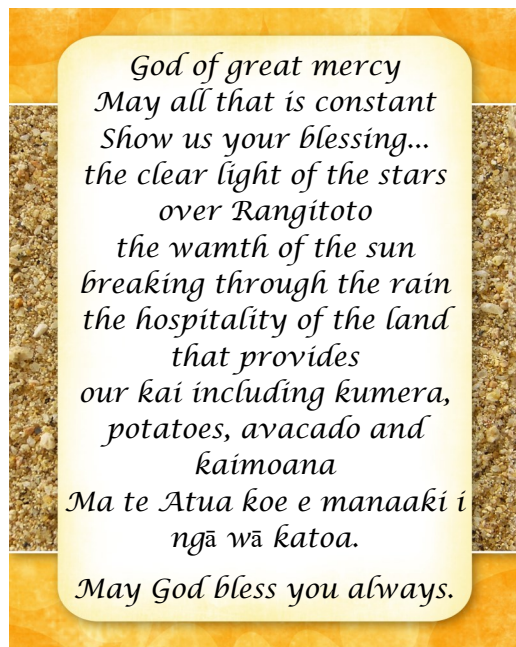

Reflection

(Is 53:10-11). This is a short excerpt from the fourth and most famous of the Servant Songs of Second Isaiah. The Servant offers his life in atonement for the sins of his people. His death will be the beginning of glorification for him and be a source of blessings for others. It was by reflecting on passages such as this that the early Christians came to an understanding of the saving sufferings and death of Jesus.

(Mk 10: 35-45). Here we see how far the apostles are from this spirit of self-sacrifice. James and John want the top places in Jesus' kingdom. Obviously they thought that his kingdom would be modelled on worldly kingdoms, where those in high places enjoy honour, power, and glory. But Jesus tells them that his disciples are not to imitate the Gentiles, whose rulers lord it over people. In his kingdom service is what makes one great. Authority in his Church must wear the unmistakable livery of service. He set the example himself. He came 'not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many' (a reference to his saving death). Thus Jesus fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah (first reading).

(Heb 4: 14-16). In Jesus we have a high priest who can sympathise with us in all our trials and sufferings. We can approach him with confidence because he knows our weaknesses and was like us in all things except sin.

O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

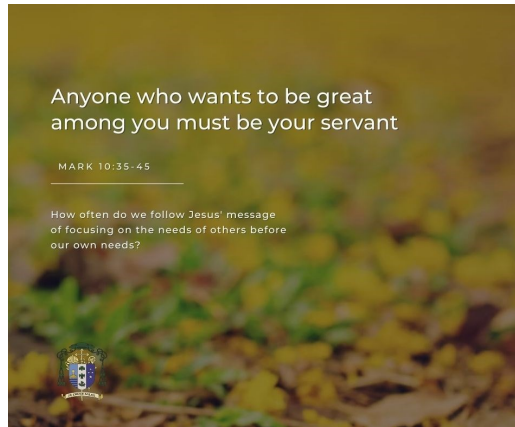
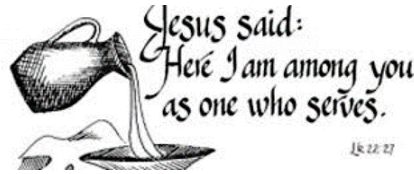
