

Reflection

(Exodus 3:1-8.13-15). This tells how God appeared to Moses in the burning bush and revealed his name as 'Yahweh' (I am the Existing One). What comes across in the incident is God's concern for his people. Fire is a symbol of love. God's love in not diminished in giving. God has heard the cries of his oppressed people, and sends Moses to liberate them from Egypt and lend them to a land 'flowing with milk and honey.' It is a turning point in the Old Testament, and leads to the Exodus and beyond. The role of Moses prefigures the role of Jesus. Through Moses God saved his people Israel from slavery in Egypt. We are the new people of God, saved through the waters of baptism from the slavery of sin, and now on route under the leadership of Jesus to the promised land of eternal life.

(1Corinthians 10:1-6.10-12). In spite of all God had done for the Israelites, most of them were not pleasing to God, with the result that they died in the desert. Paul tells the Corinthians that what happen to them is a warning for us Christians. Christians must not think that just because they have received the sacraments they are automatically saved.

(Luke 13:1-9). Here we see how Jesus rejected the popular belief that accidents that befall people are inflicted by God as punishment for sin. Still, sin calls for repentance. And Jesus tells the Jews that they will lose the promises unless they repent. The barren fig tree symbolizes the barren state of Israel. But God is patient. There is still time to repent, though that time is getting short.


